THINK it meet, as long as I am in this L tabernacle, to stir you up by putting you in remembrance; knowing that shortly I must put off this my tabernacle, even as our Lord Jesus Christ hath shewed me. More~ over I will endeavour that ye may be able after my decease to have these things always in remembrance. For we have not followed cunningly devised fables, when we made known unto you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but were eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received from God the Father honour & glory, when there came such a voice to him from the excellent glory, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. And this voice which came from heaven we heard, when we were with him in the holy mount.

THE GOSPEL. S. Lukeix. 28.

And it came to pass about an eight days after these sayings, he took Peter & John and James, and went up into a mountain to pray. And as he prayed, the fashion of his countenance was altered, and his raiment was white and glistering. And, behold, there talked with him two men, which were Moses and Elias: who appeared in glory, & spake of his decease which he should accomplish at Jerusalem. But Peter and they that were with him were heavy with sleep: and when they were awake, they saw his glory, & the two men that stood with him. And it came to pass, as they departed from him, Peter said unto Jesus, Master, it is good for us to be here: and let us make three tabernacles; one for thee, and one for Moses, & one for Elias: not knowing what he said. While he thus spake, there came a cloud, & overshadowed them: and they feared as they entered into the cloud. And there came a voice out of the cloud, saying, This is my beloved Son: hear him. And when the voice was past, desus was found alone. And they kept it close, and told no man in those days any of those things which they had seen.

The Lessons for the day are: Morning: Exodus 34v.29; 2 Corinthians 3. Evening: Malachi 4 v. 2; S. Matthew 17 to

In the Order for the Administration of the Lord's Supper, or Holy Communion.

The Prayer of Consecration is as follows:

ALL glory be to thee, Almighty God, our heavenly Father, for that thou, of thy tender mercy, didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the Cross for our redemption; who made there (by his one oblation of himself once offered) a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction, for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, & in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of that his precious death and sacrifice, until

his coming again: For in the night in which he was betrayed, (a) he took Bread; and when he had given thanks, (b) he brake it, and gave it to his discip~ les, saying, Take, eat, (c) this is my Body, which is given for you; Do this in remembrance of me. Like~ wise, after supper, (d) he took the Cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, Drink yeall of this; for (e) this is my Blood of the New Tes~ tament, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins; Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me.

(a) Here the Priest is to take the Paten into his hands.

(b) And here to break the Bread.

(c) And here to lay his hand upon all the Bread.

(d) Here he is to take the Cup into his hands.
(e) And here he is to lay his hand upon every vessel in which there is any Wine to be consecrated.

The service shall be as usual, except where it is hereby otherwise appointed.

Among the Sentences at the beginning of Morning Prayer shall be the following.

MONOUR the Lord with thy substance, and with the firstfruits of all thine increase: so shall thy barns befilled with plenty, and thy presses shall burst out with new wine. Prov. iii, 9, 10.

The lerd by wisdom hath founded the earth; by understanding hath he established the heavens. By his knowledge the depths are broken up, and the clouds drop down the dew. Prov. iii. 19, 20.

The eternal God is thy refuge, & underneath are the everlasting arms. Deut. xxxiii. 27. Israel then shall dwell in safety alone: the fountain of Jacob shall be upon a land of corn and wine; also his heavens shall drop down dew. Deut. xxxiii. 28.

Happy art thou, O Israel: who is like unto

thee, O people saved by the Lord, the shield of thy help, and who is the sword of thy excellency! Deut. xxxiii. 29.

Instead of O come, let us sing, etc., the following shall be said or sung.

PRAISE the Lord, for it is a good thing to sing praises unto our God: yea, a joy-ful and pleasant thing it is to be thankful. The Lord doth build up Jerusalem: and gather together the outcasts of Israel. He healeth those that are broken in heart: and giveth medicine to heal their sickness. O sing unto the Lord with thanksgiving: sing praises upon the harp unto our God: Who covereth the heaven with clouds, and prepareth rain for the earth: and maketh the grass to grow upon the mountains, and herb for the use of men;

Who giveth fodder unto the cattle: & feedeth the young ravens that call upon him. Praise the Lord, O Jerusalem: praise thy

God, O Sion.

For he hath made fast the bars of thy gates: and hath blessed thy children within thee. He maketh peace in thy borders: and filleth thee with the flour of wheat.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son: and to the Holy Ghost;

As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be: world without end. Amen.

Then shall be said or sung one of the Selections, or some other portion of the Psalms, at the discretion of the Minister.

The First Lesson shall be Deut. 8, and the Second Lesson shall be 1 Thess. 5 v. 12 to v. 24.

After the General Thanksgiving, shall be said this which followeth.

OST gracious God, by whose knowledge the depths are broken up, & the
clouds drop down the dew; We yield thee
unfeigned thanks and praise for the return
of seed-time and harvest, for the increase of
the ground and the gathering in of the fruits
thereof, and for all the other blessings of thy

may appear in our lives by an humble, holy,

MOST merciful Father, who hast blessed the labours of the husbandman in the returns of the fruits of the earth; We give thee humble and hearty thanks for this thy bounty; beseeching thee to continue thy loving-kindness to us, that our land may still yield her increase, to thy glory and our comfort; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

THE EPISTLE. James i. 16.

O not err, my beloved brethren. Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning. Of his own will begat he us with the word of truth, that we should be a kind of firstfruits of his creatures. Wherefore, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath: for the wrath of man worketh not the righousness of God. Wherefore lay apart all filthiness and superfluity of naughtiness, and receive with meekness the engrafted word, which is able to save your souls. But be ye doers of the word, & not hearers only, deceiv~ ing your own selves. For if any be a hearer of the word, and not a doer, he is like unto a

man beholding his natural face in a glass: for he beholdeth himself, and goeth his way, and straightway forgetteth what manner of manhewas. But whose looketh into the per~ fect law of liberty, and continueth therein, he being not a forgetful hearer, but a doer of the work, this man shall be blessed in his deed. If any man among you seem to be religious, and bridleth not his tongue, but deceiveth his own heart, this man's religion is vain. Pure religion & undefiled before God and the Father is this, To visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to keep himself unspotted from the world.

THE GOSPEL. S. Matt. v. 43.

E have heard that it hath been said, Thou shalt love thy neighbour, and hate thine enemy. But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, & persecute you; that yemay be the children of your Father which is in heaven: for he maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust. For if ye love them which love you, what reward have ye? do not even the publicans the same? And if ye salute your brethren only, what do ye more than others? do not even the publicans so? Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect.
