## THE PSALTER or PSALMS of DAVID, After the Translation of the GREAT BIBLE Pointed as they are to be Sung or Said in CHURCHES.

MORN. PR. DAY. 1.

Blessus vir in oriente ut p. 1.

**L**R. SSED is the man that hath not walked in the counsel of the ungodly; nor stood in the way of sinners; and hath not sinned in the seat of the scurif.

2 But his delight is in the law of Lord; and in his law will he exercise himself day and night.

3 And he shall be like a tree planted by the waters side; and will bring forth his fruit in due season.

4 His leafs shall not wither; and taste whatsoever he doth, it shall sweeten.

5 As for the ungodly, it is not so with them, but they are like to the chaff which the wind scattereth away from the face of the earth.

6 Therefore the ungodly shall not be able to stand in the judgment; neither the sinner in the congregation of the righteous.

7 But the Lord knoweth & was of the righteous; and the way of the ungodly shall perish.

**N**H. To the heathen so jostly they rofe together; and why do the people imagine a vain thing.

2 The kings of the earth stand up, and the rulers take conseil together; against the Lord, and against his anointed.

3 Let us break their bonds af-

ford, and cast away their cords from us.

He that dwelleth in heaven shall laugh them to scorn; & Lord shall have them in derision.

5 Then shall he speak unto y<sup>t</sup> in his wrath, and vex them in his displeasure.

6 You have I set my King upon the hater hill of Zion.

7 I will proclaim the law, whereof the Lord hath said, unto me, that set my Son on this day have thou set me on.

8 Up, Lord, and help me O my God; for thou smitest all mine enemies upon the cheek bone, thou hast broken y<sup>t</sup> teeth of the ungodly.

9 Salvation belongeth unto Lord; and thy blessing is upon thy people.

8 Lead me O Lord, in thy right counself; because mine enemies make thy way plain before my face.

9 For there is no faithfulness in his mouth; their inward parts are very wickedness;

10 Their throat is an open sepulcher, they flatter with their tongue.

11 The Lord shall judge thy people; give sentence in me, O Lord; according to thy righteousness.

12 Stand up, O Lord, in thy wrath; and lift up thy self; because of thy indignation of mine enemies; arise up for me to the judgment that thou hast commanded.

13 And let it be shewed of people come about thee; for their shame thereof lift up thyself again.

14 The Lord shall judge thy people; give sentence in me, O Lord; according to thy righteousness.

15 Cast thy wickedness off; & let not thy sins abide with thee.

16 For the righteous God trieth & very heavily.

17 We help noteth of God, who præferveth that weicre of heart.

18 God is a righteous judge, strong and patient; and god is provoked every day.

19 If a man will not turn, he will whet his sword; he hath bontis iron, and made it ready.

20 He hath prepared for him the instruments of death; he obtaineth his arrows against the persecutors.

21 O rebuke me in thine indignation; neither chasten me in thy displeasure.

22 Have mercy upon me, O Lord, for I am weak; O Lord hear me, for my bones are vexed.

23 I am foul also; I am sore troubled; but Lord how long will thou punish me? 24 Turn thee, O Lord, and deliver my soul; I save me for thy mercies sake.

3 While mine enemies are driven back; they shall fall and perish at thy presence.

4 For thou hast maintained my right, and my cause; thou art set in the throne that judgeth right.

5 Thou hast rebuked the heathen & destroyed y<sup>t</sup> ungodly; thou hast put out their name for ever & ever.

6 Other enemy destructions are come to a perpetuel end; even as cities & towns that had destroyed their memorials is perished with them.

7 But the Lord shall endure for ever; he hath also prepared his seat for judgment.

8 For he shall judge the world in righteousness; and minister judgment unto the people.

9 The Lord also will be a defence for the oppressed; even a refuge in due time of trouble.

10 And they that know thy Name, will put their trust in thee; for thou Lord hast never failed them that seek thee.

11 O praise the Lord in his dwelling in sanctification of people of his doings.

for blood he remembreth them; and forgetteth not the complaint of the poor.

12 Have mercy upon me, O Lord, consider the trouble which I suffer of them that hate me. They liftest me up from the gates of death.

14 The heathen are sunk down in the pit that they made: in gloominess hid privily, is their fire taken.

15 The Lord is known to execute judgment: ungodly is trapped in the work of his own hands.

16 The wicked shall be turned into the dust; all people of gods.

17 For the psalm shall not always be forgotten: ye ancient wisdom of mankind not perish for ever.

Unto Domine?

HY HANESTHOU SO FAR OFF, O Lord, and hidest the face in the needful time of trouble?

2 The ungodly for his own lusts persecute the poor; let them be akin in the crafty wiles of them that they have imagined.

3 For the ungodly hath made break of our hearts desire; and speaketh word of the covetous whom God abhorreth.

4 Then ungodly is so pround that he carthe not for god: neither is God in all his thoughts.

5 His ways are alwayes grievous: the judgments are farre above out of his sighte; and therefore doth he alwayes his enemis.

6 For he hath said in his heart, I shall never be cast downe there shall no harm happen unto me.

7 His mouth is full of cursing, doce and curse; under his tongue is ungodliness and vanitie.

8 He lifteth looking in of the corners of the streets; and privy in his lurking dens doth he murder the innocent; his eyes are strayinge the year.

9 For he lieth waiting secretly even as a lion to keepe his den, that he might the poor.

10 He doth varieth the poor, when he setteth him into his net.

11 He falleth downe and humblith himselfe: that the congregatioun of the poor may fall into the hands of his captioun.

12 He hath said in his heart, I am God; for gotten he hideth away his face, and he will never see it.

13 Arise, O Lord, and lift up thine hand, for it is the poor.

14 Wherefore should I minded blythe god, while doth say in his heart, I am god, car-

**I**N THE Lord put my trust, thou say vnto them to my soul, that if she should steele as a bird unto the hill?

2 For to the ungodly bend their bow and make ready their arrowes at the quiver: that they may privately shoot at them which are steele of heart.

3 I will praise the Name of the Lord most high.

15 Surely thou hast seen it for thou beheldst ungodlynes and wrong.

16 That thou mayst take & marrise into the hand, & poor committeth himselfe unto thee, for thou art the helpe of the friendles.

17 Break thou the power of ungodly and malitious, take away his ungodlynes, and thou holdest some.

18 The Lord King for ever and ever: and the heathen are periyghted out of the land.

24 I will sing of the Lord because he hath deiry to louing with me;

Disinquietus.

**T**HE ungodly said in his heart, There is no god, 2 They are corrupt, & became abominable in their doings; there is none that doth good, no none.

3 The Lord looked downe from heaven upon the children of men, to see if there were any that would understand, and seek after God.

4 But they are all gone out of way, they are altogether become abominable; there is none of doth good, no one.

5 Their thorow is an open sepulcher, where their impies have they layed; & pnyon of off is under their lips,

6 Their mouth is full of cursing and bitterness; their feete are swift to shed blodd.

7 Desirous and ungodlynes in their ways, and the way of peace have they not knowne; there is no fear of God before their eyes.
